READING AT HOME

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Important Reminders

Attendance and Punctuality:

Children should be attending school every day, unless they are ill, or have a medical appointment that cannot be taken outside school hours.

Please ensure hat you bring in evidence of ALL medical appointments.

Remember to call the school on 01482 794122, option 1, to report absences by 9am for each day off.

Please ensure your child arrives at school on time to ensure they don't receive a late mark. Regular absences are being closely monitored by our welfare team.

Collecting Children On Time:

Children must be collected on time from school, especially on a Thursday when they are ready to go home at 1.45pm.

Please inform the school as soon as possible if you are going to be delayed in collecting your children.

Thursday After School Club:

Children in the after school club on a Thursday, **cannot** be collected before 3.30pm, unless this has been agreed in advance with the office. This is very important for safeguarding reasons.

Parking Outside School:

Please can we remind parents that the yellow zigzag lines outside school are to protect children so they remain visible when they cross the road.

Children can often forget to check and double-check both sides of the road when crossing. Please help us to keep them safe by not parking or waiting in your car on these lines.

Nut-Free School

Please can we remind all parents to check ingredients of children's lunches, and to avoid sending anything that may contain nuts. This includes some chocolate spreads, peanut butter and cereal bars / biscuits, as these can cause an allergic reaction for many pupils at Griffin.
