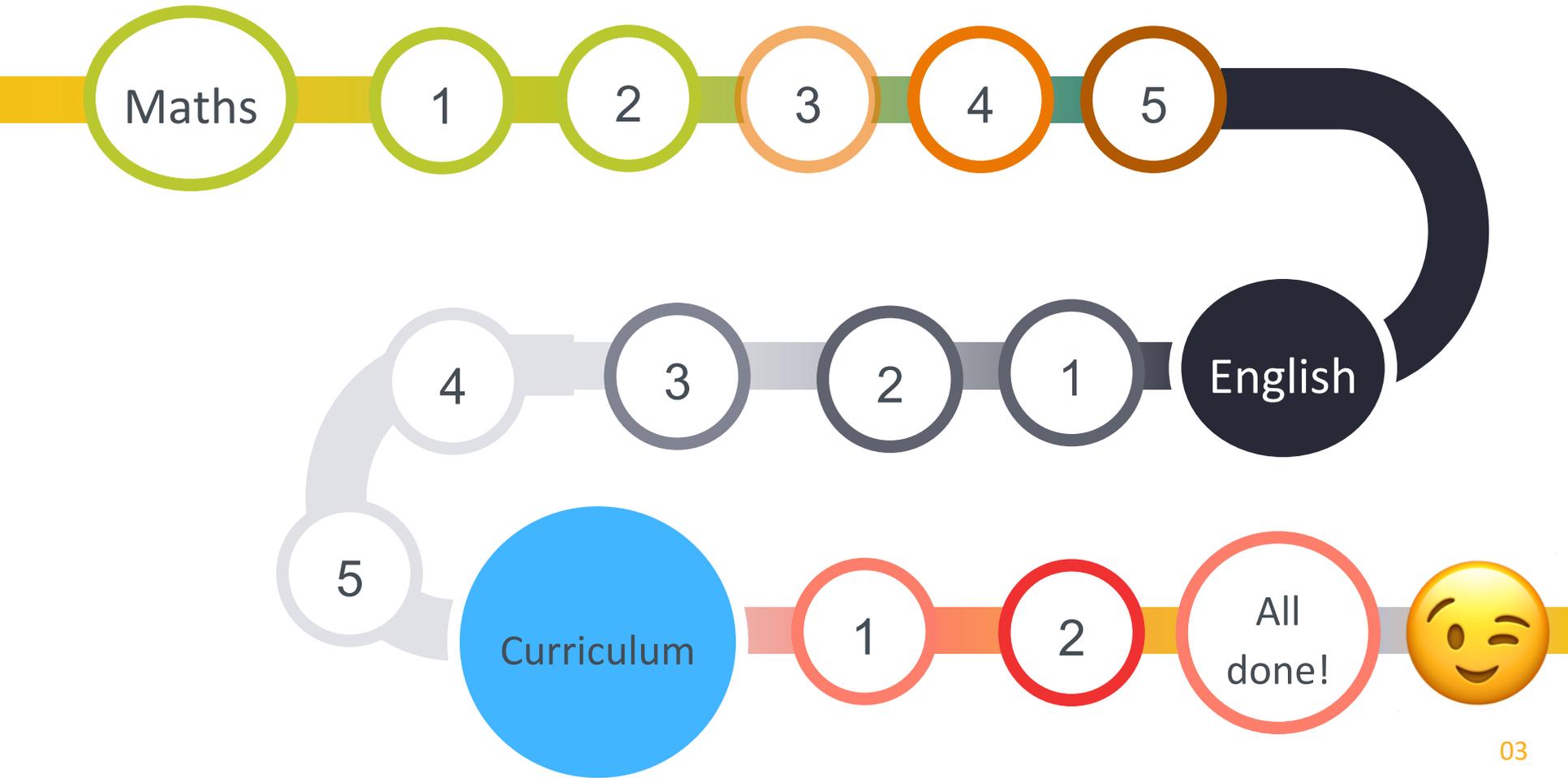

# Lesson 2: Imperative (bossy) Verb Hunter




An imperative (bossy) verb is a doing word that commands someone to **do** something. For example in the sentence below, mix tells the reader what they need to do.

Command sentences are used when you are telling someone to do something. They usually begin with an imperative verb.


*From the sentences below, identify the command sentences.*



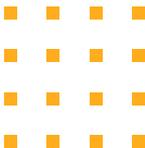
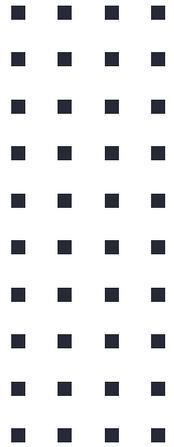
