If your child needs someone to talk to because of anything which has upset them, it could be that they are being bullied or that they have seen something online which they wish they hadn't, there are a number of places they can go.

Children can ring Childline on **0800 1111** and speak to trained counsellors about any problems they may face. Childline is run by the NSPCC and is there to help your child.

CEOP is a law enforcement agency run by the National Crime Agency (NCA).

Instagram

Instagram is a social networking app for sharing photos and videos from a smartphone. Similar to Facebook or Twitter, everyone who creates an Instagram account has a profile and a news feed. When you post a photo or video on Instagram, it displays on your profile. Other users who follow you see your posts in their feed. If a user has their profile set to private, they must approve your request first. When your profile is created and set to public, anyone can find and view your profile, along with your photos and videos. You must be over the age of 13 to use Instagram.
