Maths

The Very Hungry Caterpillar

Click on the link to watch and listen to the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. How many apples does the caterpillar eat? Ask your child to say the number and show you how many using their fingers. How many pears, plums, strawberries and oranges does he eat?

CHALLENGE: Can your child say the days of the week in order?

Words to investigate

Talk about what these words mean. Model how to say each word and ask your child to copy. Challenge: Discuss the life cycle of a butterfly. Can your child tell you what comes first?
