Attendance expectations

Griffin Primary School expects all children to have **100%** attendance and punctuality.

Gates open at 8.30am every morning.

Doors are open from 8.40 until 8.55am every morning for pupils to come into school.

The doors which each year group should use are listed below:

- Red door Reception
- Green door Year 1 and 2
- Yellow door Year 3 and 4TH
- White door 4SS
- Blue door Year 6
- Quad door Year 5

School starts at 8.55am and all pupils must be in school and ready to learn at this time.

Children who are 5 minutes late each day will miss 25 minutes of learning each week. Over half a term this means they will have missed 2 and a half hours of learning time which has a big impact on the progress pupils will make.

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
The importance of good attendance and punctuality

Reporting absences

Parents have a responsibility to ensure that their children attend school regularly and to let the school know immediately if their child cannot attend school and the reason for such absence.

An absence can be reported by contacting the school office on **01482 794122** and either speaking to a member of staff or leaving a voicemail on the answerphone.

If a child is absent and there has been no contact with the school, the school will phone parents/carers to find out the reason for the absence. A home visit may be carried out on the first or second day of absence.

If a child is absent from school for three days, a home visit will definitely take place. The staff who may carry out a home visit are listed with their photographs on the left.

Where pupils have a medical appointment during school time, proof of the appointment will be requested before the absence is authorised.

If any issues arise which may affect your child's attendance, please speak to a member of staff so that this can be discussed and resolved.

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
