Summer 2-Down on the Farm

Literacy- Our text this half term will be Little Red Hen. We will use this story to re-tell and innovate. We will write sentences about the story and the characters. We will also be looking at the non-fiction text, 'Chicks and Eggs'. We are continuing our reading practice x3 a week too. These sessions help with fluency and understanding.

Maths- We will be using what we have been taught over the year to ensure we are secure in our understanding. We will concentrate on number bonds to 10 as well as odds and evens. We will also learn how to use rekenreks, ready for Year 1.

Expressive Arts- This half term we will be exploring songs about The Little Red Hen as well as exploring a glockenspiel. In DT we will be making some bread and, of course, will have the opportunity to try it!

Understanding the World- We will be learning about the different types of farm animals and their role in the farm. We will learn facts about chickens and create maps of our own farmyard. We will also be looking at how our food is grown on farms.

Physical Development- We will be exploring races and becoming confident in the different skills for these.

PSED- We will learn about 'Changing Me' and how we grow and develop from being a baby to an adult.
